

Regulations Governing the Use of Tracking Devices at AKC Pointing Dog Events

The following Regulations become effective August 1, 2009.

The use of tracking devices is solely for locating the dog once the dog is no longer under judgment. Information obtained through the use of a tracking device must not be used to aid the handler, scout or judges. If the host club allows tracking devices, the following regulations on their use will apply.

1. AKC Approved – Only tracking devices approved by the AKC Performance Events Department will be permitted. The collar and receiver must be used as received from the manufacturer. No modifications may be made other than name tags may be added. The collar surface against the dog's neck shall be flat. Approval will include both the collar and the receiver.
2. Carrying Receivers – The scout may not carry a receiver. The handler may carry a receiver with the permission of the Judges. The receiver must be turned off while the dog is under judgment.
3. Receivers in the Gallery Must Be Turned Off – No one in the gallery shall track the dogs while the dogs are under judgment.
4. No "Outside" Communications – No one shall communicate in any manner with the handler, scout, judges or gallery any information obtained through the use of a tracking device while the dogs are under judgment. This includes the use of cell phones.
5. Receivers May Only Be Used Once the Dog is No Longer Under Judgment – Receivers shall only be activated once judgment has concluded. If a dog is gone at time, the dog is still under judgment until the judges indicate otherwise.
6. Dogs Lost From Previous Braces – If a dog is lost from a previous brace, the handler and scout may use their receivers during the next brace solely for the purpose of locating their dog. Once the dog is located, they must immediately turn off their receivers. They must not communicate any information they obtain through the use of their receivers concerning the dogs currently under judgment.
7. Judges May Not Consider Information Obtained Through Tracking Devices – Judges are not to consider any information obtained through the use of a tracking device. No one shall use information from a tracking device to attempt to influence a judge or to discredit the judge's decision.
8. The use of a tracking collar is an elective and it is the handler's responsibility to furnish the device. The running of a stake shall not be held up due to the lack of a tracking device.
9. Two-Collar Rule – A dog may wear no more than two collars. All collars shall be worn on the dog's neck. If the handler elects to use a tracking collar, it shall remain on the dog during the entire time the dog is under judgment. If the handler removes the tracking collar, the dog shall be considered out of judgment. *Only one of the two collars may be a tracking collar.*
10. The use of tracking devices is at the discretion of the host club. For both Field Trials and Hunting Tests, the premium list must state that tracking devices are not allowed, otherwise they will be allowed.
11. Rescinding Use – Use of specific tracking devices may be rescinded at any time by the AKC Performance Events Department if the regulations pertaining to their use become overly difficult to enforce or in the case of repeated misuse.
12. Tracking devices may be worn during call backs, including a call back for retrieve. If a dog did not wear a tracking collar during its brace, it may not wear one in a call back.

Note – Electronic flashing collars are not allowed in AKC Pointing Breed field events.

If an Event Committee determines a violation of these Regulations may have occurred, the accused (which includes anyone involved in the misuse of the tracking device including the act of communicating improperly obtained information) shall be charged with misconduct. An Event Committee hearing must be held. If the Event Committee determines through the hearing process that a violation did occur, the accused shall be immediately suspended from all forms of participation in AKC Pointing Breed field events. The dog shall be disqualified from the stake.

An updated list of approved devices will be published and available at the trial.

ENEBC and SNEBC cordially invite you to attend their spring trials to be held at Arcadia Management Area in Exeter, RI from May 11-13, 2018.

NOTE: For Friday, ENEBC will allow horseback handling in all stakes except Amateur Walking Hunting Dog. Handlers must provide their own horses as a wrangler will not be present at the trial. For the SNEBC walking trial taking place on Saturday and Sunday, handlers must walk in all stakes. Entries will be limited to daylight hours for all three days.

Entry Submission: Although application/approval/advertisement/premium publication has been handled separately by each club; in order to facilitate entry submission, a single field trial secretary has been designated to handle entries. In order to prevent the field trial secretary from losing her mind, please follow these rules for submitting entries:

1. For each entry, state registered name, call name, reg # for AKC, reg # for American Field, breed, sex, birthdate (of dog) and who will be handling
2. List for each dog entered, the day (Fri, Sat or Sun) and the stake entered
3. All entries will be confirmed via email. Be sure to verify that the email has confirmed your entries correctly
4. Make sure you fill out the ENEBC form for the Friday stakes and the SNEBC form for the Sat/Sun stakes
5. Payment via check for Friday stakes must be payable to Eastern New England Brittany Club (or ENEBC) and payment via check for Sat/Sun stakes must be payable to Southern New England Brittany Club (or SNEBC)
6. Forms and payment, if not provided ahead of time, will be accepted at the trial

For both clubs: Please email your entries to patriciacarney@gmail.com or phone entries to 978-239-9009. Alternatively, entries may be snail mailed to the FT secretary. Paperwork and fees must be submitted before any dog is run. Entries will close at 5:00 PM, Wednesday May 9, 2018. Bracing information will be available after 9:30 PM, and will be emailed to all entrants at that time.

TRACKING COLLARS: Their use will be permitted at these trials. Only the AKC-approved collars may be used. See reverse side of ENEBC entry form for rules governing their use. A list of approved collars will be available at the trial.

Reminder: Except for water on the course for the dogs, water is not available on the grounds. Camping is permitted on the grounds. There are no hookups.

Food: Lunch will be provided all three days. Happy Hour will take place on Friday and Saturday evening and will include the awarding of ribbons for the day's placements. Any donations to Happy Hour will be graciously accepted.

Directions: From I-395 – Take exit 85 onto Route 138 East. Follow 138 until it intersects with Route 185 outside of Voluntown, CT. Follow 165 East into RI. Continue past Beach Pond to the white church on left. Turn left at the church on to Frosty Hollow Rd. Turn left at the end toward the field trial grounds.
From the north: I-95 south to exit 5A (102 south). Follow 102 for about half a mile until you reach Route 3. Turn right on Route 165 and drive about 1.5 miles to the blinking yellow light. Turn right on Route 65 (Ten Rod Rd.). Drive about 2.8 miles to the white church, turn right onto Frosty Hollow Rd. and proceed to the trial grounds per directions above.
From New London, CT: I-95 north to exit 4 (Route 3). Drive north on Route 3 to the blinking yellow light and turn left on Route 65 (Ten Rod Rd.) Follow previous directions to the trial grounds.
