EDITORIAL

The writing of an Editorial is one of the duties of an Editor. I shall accept this duty, but must, at the same time emphasize the fact that, as an Editorial, this is only a personal opinion, reflecting in no way the policy or the thinking of the Officers or committee chairmen of the American Brittany Club.

An individual, or a group, can not remain static and still remain strong and healthy. Growth, movement, progress are essential to any group—and the A. B. C. is not an exception. The American Brittany Club has demonstrated its ability to grow and progress, and as a result is now quite healthy.

Since we are growing and progressing, it is of the greatest importance that we know where we are going—What is our goal as a club, and what route shall we take to arrive at this goal.

This movement, this change and growth, should be done in an orderly fashion, one step at a time. Needless to say, it would be most helpful if most of us understood the route to be followed and were in agreement on the final goal.

Let me add that I hope that the ultimate perfection that we seek as an organization will never quite be reached, because once we reach the place were no improvement can be made we will no longer have a reason for existing.

So let me now chart the steps, as I would hope to see them, on The American Brittany Club's road ahead.

1. Establishment of realistic, meaningful Field Trial Rules.

Rules are meant to be observed, and the observance of these rules should be efectively enforced. If Rules are unjust, or do not realistically meet the situation, they should be changed.

At the National Meeting a set of rules (recommended procedures) was voted on and passed by the Board of Directors. These rules can not be obeyed as there is no way to enforce them, since they are not within the rules of the American Kennel Club. The fact that these recommendations are not followed by some of our regional clubs further indicates that these rules are felt to be incorrect by the groups that are not using them.

Therefore in the areas of seeming conflict, I suggest the following. These suggestions are made NOT AS MY PERSONEL OPINION, but in the spirit of what I believe would be in the best interest of the National organization.

A. Horseback handling (as a means of transportation only) in stakes over 45 minutes in length.

Horseback handling in regional club stakes of less than 45 minutes, at the option of the circuit.

Ex;—If a majority of the clubs in the circuit (East Coast, Central Midwest, and West Coast) approves horseback handling, then every club in that circuit will agree to allow this.

In the regional trials, horseback handling should be optional, and as much as possible, riders should be braced together and walkers should be braced together. When this is not possible, the walker shall set the pace.

Scouts in any form should not be used and the marshall should have the authority to stop any attept at scouting, or hurrying the walking handler or dogs. His word should be absolute, to the extent that he may declare a dog out of judgement if he feels that this is being purposely done in contrary purpose to his orders. In all cases the horse shall serve only as a means of transportation and as an elevated platform to afford the handler a better view of his dog.

B. Naming of stakes. In the interests of Standardization of terms

and agreement as to definition, the following stakes only shall be allowed:- Open Puppy, Derby, and All Age, and Amateur All Age or Amateur Gun Dog.

- C. Limiting Stakes to Brittany Spaniels only may cause a hardship in some areas, so if a mixed breed stake is used it should be limited to the Amateur Stake. Further, I feel that it would be a falsification of the term "Field Champion" for a dog to garner most of the points towards this championship in A.K.C. trials for other breeds. This would be as erroneous as it would be to name a Brittany a Bench Champion who has been shown on the bench only against Poodles. Therefore it would seem wise to make it mandatory that at least one major All Age Stake (three points) be won in a trial for Brittany Spaniels only, before the requirements for a Field Championship can be met.
- D. The present disqualifications as listed in the standards shall apply in the field as well as on the bench, since these standards actually define the breed. These disqualifications are:—Black, tail longer than 4", size over 20½" or under 17½", and spayed bitches.
- E. When finalized, these rules—or any agreed upon set of rules should be presented to the AKC with the strong suggestion that

AKC accept them as our running rules and support us in enforcing them.

2. A.B.C. Activities-

Every member should at some time have the opportunity to run his dog in a high calibre stake of National prestige on his accustomed type of terrain, and on the game bird of his fancy. This is truly the purpose of the Classics. The classics should be moved from one part of the country to the other, depending on the ability of the various clubs to meet the criteria for grounds, birds, accomodations, etc. This should prevent any one area from looking upon any of these events as its own, and will increase the stature of the Classics.

Eventually each classic should have its own futurity to run with it. The National structure of events would then be as follows—National trials—National Championship — National Amateur Stake—National Specialty.

Classics—Pheasant, Grouse and Quail each with a futurity.

Bench Futurity — To be alternated from time to time to be shown with one of the various field futurities.

I realize that this has been lengthy. It will take a good deal longer to put the many steps described into being. The steps if followed will, I hope, bring us a lot closer to a better Brittany with every member better able to show this better Brittany to advantage.

Let me write my views on a subject that I think is important to Brittany Clubs all over; i.e. Birdfields and birds for puppies.

One judge says, "You don't judge puppies on bird work, so why have birds around to confuse the issue?"

All the judging books that I have read agree that you do not judge puppies on bird work, and yet I recently heard a judge say, "I had to place that

pup because he had three finds." His finds consisted of stumbling over three wet birds that happened to be in his path. Then he turned and grabbed each bird. Not even a flash point! The birds might just as well have been a biscuit as far as the pups was concerned. This kind of placement can only hurt the Brittany as a breed. There were other pups that hunted well in the back course, but were thoroughly confused by the hacking and urging of their handlers in the bird field. Birdfields are no good for puppies.

Others argue that the birds be spaced out on the back course. This was tried in one of our first trials with the result that the first braces of pups caught all of the birds that couldn't fly well and chased the flyers out of the country. The rest of the stake went birdless even though some real good pups ran the birdless course well.

We really confuse our judges when we plant birds for puppies and then tell the judges that bird work doesn't count. Are they not going to get the impression that all we want in our Brittanies is a meat dog?

In puppies are we looking for a potential top all age dog? If so, why not look for such things as Nose, Joy in Hunting, Intelligence, Style, Pace, Drive, and Bird Sense. All of these characteristics can be observed in a good pup running a birdless course. All the wild life in the field leaves behind effluvia to attract the nose of a good pup. Joy in hunting can be seen in the way he chases field birds, etc. Style, Pace and Drive he shows in his manner of moving over the ground. Intelligence shows in his handling—the way he moves from possible birdy cover to new

cover shows his bird sense as well as intelligence.

So why confuse the judges with planted birds? Or confuse the pups by hacking then down, instead of allowing them to use their good bird sense.

Planted birds substitute luck for quality in our puppy stakes, and can only be detrimental to our favorite breed of hunting dogs in the future.

A SUGGESTED CHANGE IN THE FUTURITY STAKE

by Dave Story

The three stakes of the 1960 National Field Trial Championships of the American Brittany Club attracted a total of 168 entries. The actual running began early on the morning of November 26 and it required two days to run off the 45 dogs entered in the National Amateur Stake. This involved 23 heats of 45 minutes each, or 8½ hours running time in one day and 9 hours the following day.

The 13th Futurity Stake began on November 28 and required three full days to complete the entry of 76 dogs. This required 6½ hours of running time

The National Championship Stake had an entry of 47 dogs and, including call backs, required three full days of running. This meant 24 hour-long heats, or 3 days of eight hours running time each; plus call backs.

The award to the new National Champion and the announcement of the three other placements took place in the quickening dusk in front of the stables. Weary handlers paused in the process of feeding their dogs to applaud and to congratulate the winners. A tired horse stumbled on the way to his stall and straggler geese, dark silhouttes by this time passed overhead on the way to the lake. The 1960 Nationals were over. 168 entries, 60 hours of running time in 8 days of an average 7½ hours a day.

For the faithful few who were left to hold post-mortems, the following conclusions were inescapable:

- 1. The field trial committee had done a really excellent job under conditions which could best be described as "trying".
- 2. The weather, the gallery, and the social aspects of the trial were fine, BUT!!!
 - 3. The trial had run too long.
 - 4. Quail were scarce.
- 5. Asking two judges to oversee the running of 123 dogs over a five day period was too much.
- 6. In order to run off the large entry it was necessary to start very early in the morning and run late in the afternoon and the dogs who drew the early and late braces were at a definite disadvantage.
- 7. The horses had been ridden long and hard and were tired as was the stable boss who got up early and came home late each day.
 - 8. The dogs who ran on the last day

of the trial were covering ground which had been over by dogs and horses for 7 days previously and the quail, what few there were, had pulled back into deeper cover.

9. Lack of time especially in the Futurity, worked against having call backs.

In order to correct some of the correctable aspects of the trial the following plans are being instituted for the 1961 Nationals: time limits of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for each days running will be established; separate judges will be used for all three stakes, BUT!!!

It is expected that it will take 10 days to run this years trial. Horses will still be tired, quail will still be spooky and those few people who can afford to spend 10 days, to say nothing of travel time, at the trial will be very scarce.

The entry in the Futurity shows unmistakable signs of increase for future years, as do all entries and this is a healthy sign for the club providing the procedure for handling the trial keeps pace with the large entry. Unless members discuss this problem in their regional fall meetings and come to the 1961 Nationals prepared to consider a solution for the 1962 Nationals, the problem could have some unfortunate consequences.

Some of the proposals discussed at last years Nationals were: raising the qualifications for entry in the National and Amateur Stakes, holding regional elimination trials to decide National entries, and separating the Futurity from the National and Amateur Stakes. The seperation of the Futurity has much to recommend it. Assuming that the National or Amateur Stakes would be started on a Saturday and would require 5 or 6 days to complete, it would then be possible to begin the Futurity on the following Saturday on grounds not too far from the Nationals (Ardmore, Oklahoma has been suggested). This would allow for sufficient time and the Professionals would be gathered for the Nationals. The hospitality of the Crab Orchard would not be extended to its limits as it was last year. (This could, unless corrected, result in being denied use of the Crab Orchard grounds.)

If the Futurity was held separately the National could be held first and some Amateurs would be able to enter their dogs in both stakes without the wait in between. It would also allow the professionals to move to the Futurity

grounds in plenty of time to work the young dgos if they wished to do so. By holding the National first the Calcutta would be affected with a possible loss of money for the Club, but there some arguments against the Calcutta as well as for it.

For the reasons just mentioned the Futurity Chairman proposed to make the following recommendation at the 1961 Annual Meeting of the American Brittany Club: Due to the amount of time involved in the running of the Futurity and for other numerous reasons it is proposed that the 15th (1962) Futurity Stake be held at a time and place other than the Amateur and National Championship Stakes: said time to begin not later than 10 days following the completion of the Nationals and said place to be reasonably convenient to the site of the Nationals.

It is further resolved that the Officers of the American Brittany Club, together with the Futurity Chairman, be given the necessary authority to make the arrangements required by the proposed change in the running of the Futurity.

This resolution should be discussed on the local level and if improvements can be suggested they should be brought to the attention of the Futurity Chairman prior to the Annual Meeting. Directors should be instructed as to how to vote on this issue, but let this question, as all questions should be, answered solely on the basis of "What is best for the American Brittany Club."

NEW ORAL AGENT SUPPRESSES HEAT IN FEMALE DOGS

A new oral drug has been developed that will effectively suppress heat in the female dog without altering her ability to conceive and carry pups at a later time.

Prodox, a product of the Upjohn Company, has been 100% effective in preventing estrus in trials that lasted up to two years. When the medication is stopped the bitch will come into season normally, probably within a few months. However it is recommended that a six-month waiting period be observed before breeding the bitch.

Prodox acts best preventively, and so should be started 30 days before she comes into season, and can be given as long as one desires to prevent estrus. The dose is figured on body weight.

This may well prove a boon to the owners of trial or hunting bitches that come into "heat" during the trial or hunting season.

BELLOAKS KENNELS

In an earlier issue of THE AMERICAN BRITTANY, the Leeway Kennels were spotlighted. Now we turn the same spotlight on the Belloaks Kennels, and hope that in future issues, we will be able to feature an article about another of the outstanding Brittany Kennels in America.

The Belloaks Kennels, owned by Jim and Marcelle Bell, acquired their first Brittany, Sue of Loufel from Lou Ufford in the Fall of 1944.

At that time Jim was a Captain in Uncle Sam's Army, stationed at Tallahassee, Florida. Jim sent Sue to Tommy Cox in Indiana where she was assigned the role of brood bitch.

Each year Belloak's starts the names of their pups with a different letter, running in alphabetical order, making it easy to figure the age of the pups. The first letter used was "D", since Jim had previously used "A", "B", and "C" for his pointers. These "D" pups never made the field trial circuit, but the "E" pups did and both Elmos and Ezra were run in the National Puppy Stake in New Jersey in 1949. Elmos placed and was later sold. Ezra, however, went on to make a name for himself under the Belloak banner.

Belloaks first futurity entries were in 1949 and can be found in the September "The Brittany Field and Bench". They did not run in the Futurity. Belloak's Tommie, who was listed at the same time was later sold, and as far as is known is still alive in Conn. In the same issue two Belloaks pups are shown placing in trials—Cheri of White Hub (Dam of Belloaks Ibby) and Belloaks Mike.

1953 was a high point in the chronicle of Belloaks. Belloaks Ginger, handled by Marcelle Bell won the National Amateur Shooting Dog. This very fine dog was deprived of an opportunity for many further glories when she died following a snake bite. It was in her memory that the Bells inaugurated The Belloaks Ginger Memorial Trophy. This very well known and respected trophy is offered each year

at the National Trials to the best dog handled by a woman.

Marcelle came back in 1959 to again win the National Amateur All Age Stake, this time with Dual Champion Belloaks King.

Belloaks has been a consistant supporter of the dual dog. As the ultimate proof to their steadfastness to this ideal, we have only to look to the Belloaks Dual Family — probably the only "Family" of Dual Champions to be in active competition at the same time; Dual Champion Belloaks Highflyer (sire), Dual Champion Belloaks Ibby (dam), and Dual Champion Belloaks King (son).

These three have also been named on the Henry P. Davis' Sports Afield, "All America Sporting Dogs Teams".

Dual Champion Belloaks Ibby is the only female to date, to be listed in the top ten all time winners. At this writing she has 41 All Age placements in Brittany Stakes and a first place in the Nutmeg Ladies Pointer and Setter Stake, the first Brittany to win this stake.

Dual Champion Belloaks King in addition to the honors all ready mentioned has further distinguished himself with a first place in the Southern Rhode Island Field Trial—Shooting Dog Stake Mixed Trial, and a second place in the Bird Dog Association of New Hampshire with 23 dogs in the stake.

Quoting from the write-up of this trial, "Invading Brittanies have again scored heavily in pointer and setter trials."

These placements mean considerably more when we realize that this was done in the East whree not too many Brittanies are run or even given a passing glance in pointer and setter trials.

We of the American Brittany Club, will do well to seek the council of these and other kennel owners nad breeders that have long and steadily kept the best interests of the breed and the organization in the forefront of their thinking and actions.


