Brace 1

Jolly's Royal Point Reagan, Dan Jolly

Pretty Blue Eyes A Sweet Touch of Charlie B, Bob Bakas

We broke away at 8:37 am. Both dogs broke strong with great range. As we headed left at the top of the hill, Charlie broke to the right. Reagan returned from a cast on the right and joined his handler to the front. Charlie ended his bid at 10, under a bird on the right

hedgerow. Reagan continued until 15 where he went on point at the end of hires field and left when the bird flushed wild.

Brace 2

Kip's Bay Flat Out Ridge Run-N Annie, John Kipp
Rebelflame Run For The Roses, Mary Tyson

Broke away at 9:03 am in the Hire's field. Both dogs made some wide snappy casts. At 8 minutes, Rosie had a stop to flush on the right edge before the dog leg field. Both dogs continued their forward race until 18 minutes when Annie hit point in a mowed strip just before the hill down to the boy scout bridge. Rosie had a nice back. It was a dead bird which was thrown and shot fired. As we headed down the hill, Annie had a clean find on the left at 28. A few minutes later, Annie scored a second find in a small island before the boy scout bridge. Rosie was to the front, but didn't have any bird contact until the second hedgerow in the derby course where she was leashed. Annie had another find at 45 on the left edge as we entered the derby course. Annie had her final find on the hedgerow before the sand road just before time, all was in order.

Brace 3

Hy Steppin Ali's Got Attitude, Chris Sennott
Kdel's Eagle Magnum Hotshot, Ken Delong

Broke away at 10:25, just beyond the sand road. These 2 dogs exhibited great range in the search for birds. Ali had her first find on the left edge just before the dyke, at 18 minutes. Shooter was to the



front and over the dyke and Ali and her handler quickly caught the front. Both ranged wide in the open fields from the big oak toward the orchard. At 37, both dogs were found standing together on the hedgerow into the orchard. At 45 minutes just before the gun dog parking lot Ali stood for a find, the bird released on its own and Shooter had a stop to flush on that bird. Both finished the hour strong, as we entered the derby course.

Brace 4

Saradac's Dangerous Diamond Caper, Lisa Pollock
Miss Behavin', Dan Dodson

Breakaway at 1 pm. Ivy was a tad closer and working in front of Dan while Caper cast herself wide to the right. Making the turn towards the gap on the low side of Hire's field Cap was still wide right and was pointed in the right hedgerow. Ivy came in from the 2 track and failed to back and was leashed. Caper handled the pressure with a clean find. Moving forward up the hedgerow she had another clean find. Moving up Hire's field Caper appeared warm looking for water. She took a mud bath in the 2 track before lighting out again. She swung wide left toward the horse parking lot gate and then worked her way back across to the far right hedgerow. She pointed staunchly and Lisa had to walk 300 + yards to flush for her. All was in order and she was moved on. Going down the hill toward the boy scout bridge, Caper again pointed at 55 with all in order.

Brace 5

Starlight's Mercury Out Ryder, Teresa Richmond
NMR Labyrinth Nite Summer Skye, Eddie Manifold

Broke away at the derby course. At 5, Ryder had his first find on the back side of the second hedgerow on the derby course. Skye came in for a back. At 37, Ryder hit point on the left edge just before the dyke. It was a pile of feathers and he was moved on. Ryder caught the front without his handler and point was called for him by the course marshal at the hedgerow entrance to the orchard at 57. The marshal remained with Ryder while Teresa made the long uphill trek to her dog. Skye ran a good race, but only had a back and a stop to flush along the way.

Brace 6

6A Scratch
6B moved to 18B

Brace 7

Burning Glen Cover Girl, Mike Mercanti
Dogwood's Benelli, Bob Bakas (for Todd Parmenter)

Broke away at 3:57 pm in the orchard. At 3, Benny went on point and Lucy backed. Unfortunately, Benny went with the flush. As we entered the derby course, Lucy was pointed in the wooded area on

the left side as we came up from the wooden bridge. At 23, Lucy pointed again on the right side of the first hedgerow into the derby course. No bird was produced. At 34, Lucy established point on the next hedgerow in the high grassy area. Upon relocation she had a breach of manners.

Brace 8

Red Granite Henry Will Be A Star, Bob Bakas
Magnum High Velocity Top Gun, Vince Anderson

After a fog delay on Saturday morning, we broke away at 9:10 am. Both dogs had a strong start. Henry ranged wide to the left showing in front as we went down the hill to the apple tree. As we headed back up the hill at 6, Gunner was seen standing on the right edge. Handler was not able to produce the bird and upon relocation, Gunner ended his bid. Henry continued his strong race on the edges of the Hire's field. He had a find on the far end of the field. Henry left no stone unturned, but wasn't able to come up with another find until 40 as we approached the boy scout bridge. Henry shortened some as we headed down cardiac hill and entered the derby course. He appeared to go on point by the sorghum strip, but it turned out to be the remnants of a lucky deer hunter from earlier in the day. We thank Ron Gulembo and Cindy Cropek for removing the remains before we encountered this part of the course again! Henry finished the hour with a stop to flush on the next hedgerow.

Brace 9

Kala's Thunder And Lightning Shortbarrels, Tom Christnagel
Sigbrit's Evil Side Of The Road, Eddie Manifold

Broke away at 10:18 after the second hedgerow on the derby course. Ren was in and out of pocket for a while, but after crossing the wooden bridge, he had a find on the hedgerow before the sand road, with Boomer backing nicely. Ren had a second find after the sand road on the hedgerow to the right side. At 20, Boomer was not pleasing his handler and was leashed, while Ren was seen under a bird up front.

Brace 10

Atos, Jackie Hutwagner
Hall's Baby Girl Madelyn, Shaun Hall

Breakaway at 11 am. At 2, Atos hit point on the left wooded edge. No bird was produced. Maddie continued her very snappy race forward, and hit point at 8, with Atos coming in for a back (Jackie was not far behind). Maddie was relocated and Atos moved on. Maddie was leashed for self-relocating while handler flushed. At 20, Atos had a find in the field by the big oak. He continued to zip along the orchard, hitting as many objectives as possible. He had a second





find in the orchard and cast wide to the right, where he encountered 2 bikers that were heading in our direction. Atos was heeled across the dyke while the course marshal rode to the bikers and had them hold up. All was in order as we crossed the wooden bridge and headed for the derby course. Atos took some time to be sent forward from the right side of the first hedgerow, but when he came forward, he finished well as we headed up cardiac hill.

Brace 11

Fairleah's Gambit, Richard Johnson

Bark River Fresh Water Pearl, Jeff Stanton

Broke away at 1:43. Pearl was seen standing on the right edge just up the hill from the apple tree. Chess failed to back and was leashed. Pearl scored her second find by the cattails before the Hire's field. At 17, after working the entire center line of the Hire's field, Pearl established point by the fence in the Hire's field, all in order. Seen standing again at 30 on the right side before the dog leg field, Pearl was relocated with no bird produced. At 30, she had another unproductive at the cross hedgerow in the dog leg field.

Brace 12

Declared in Season, moved to the last brace

Waypoint Deacon Of The Hunt, Thom Christnagel

Broke away 2:29 pm. Deke hunted well for his handler, but after disappearing in the sorghum strip in the derby course he was leashed as he came out under birds.

Brace 13

Parker de L'Etoile du Nord, Robert White

Bantam'n Dr Jac's Shooter, Mike Magnuson

Broke away at 3:07 pm on the derby course. These 2 dogs hunted well together. After the wooden bridge they gained some range. At 14 they were both standing by a small mott to the left of the hedgerow before the sand road, birds were produced and all was in order. At 27, Shooter pointed before we head down the hill. No birds were produced. After the dyke, Shooter drew the line out toward Riverside and went on point. Parker displayed bad manners and was leashed. At 50, Shooter displayed excellent manners on a bird that crossed the path in front of him as we approached the orchard. He had another find at 52 in the orchard. He finished the hour in the orchard.

Brace 14

Rebelflame Ace Alec Hentges, Mary Tyson

Nalko de Sentier du Ramier, Jackie Hutwagner

Broke away at 8:36 am Sunday morning. Ace was somewhat out of pocket at the start, while Nalko scored his first find at 5 along the

right edge after the apple tree. Nalko had a second find at 10 while catching up to Ace, who was already into the Hire's field. At 15, Ace had a find at the end of the field, with Nalko backing. Nalko then cast out toward the island in Hire's field and scored another find at 20. Five minutes later, Nalko had a breach of manners and was up. Ace took a good deal of time working the dog leg field. When he headed forward, he pointed on the cross hedge row and pointed a dead bird. Ace went on to make some very wide casts as we headed down toward the boy scout bridge. He had another find on the left edge just before the bridge. He finished the hour as we approached cardiac hill.

Brace 15

Romence's Life Of Riley, Julie Romence

It's 5 O'Clock Somewhere, Rebecca Walters

Broke away at 9:51 at the derby course. Riley scored her first find on the left side of the second hedge row. Cooper was ahead and did not stop when a bird flushed wild. Riley ran very independently. She had her next find on the right edge after the wooden bridge, and another on the right hedge row before the sand road at 24. At 30, Riley pointed on the cross hedge row after the sand road. At 35, Riley locked up along the path on the S-turn in the woods. No bird was produced. At 50, she had another find on the left side before the hill. She finished her hour at the dyke, with the same independence that she began with.

Brace 16

Dogwood's Moose, Chris Logan

Hall's Baby Girl Sophie, Shawn Hall

Break away at 11:13 after the dyke. Both dogs were powerful off the breakaway. They were seen at the end of the tree line, almost to Riverside drive in an instant. As they drew up the hill toward the orchard, Sophie had a stop to flush on the left side of the woods edge, while Moose had a clean find off to the right. At 9, Moose had a find on the hedgerow entering the orchard, with Sophie backing nicely. Both dogs covered the orchard with great speed, not missing a single objective. At 12, Moose was seen on the bottom right edge of the orchard, but quickly came up the hill heading to the left side, where he went on point. Sophie honored again. Both dogs worked their way across the dyke and took off as we headed for the wooden bridge. At 35, Moose recorded another find on the derby course. Both dogs came out of cardiac hill and headed for the quarry. Moose went on point again after the sorghum strip, with Sophie backing once again. After an extensive flushing attempt both dogs were sent on to finish the hour just before the last hill leading to the quarry.



Brace 17**Cedar Glen Disruptin' The Peace, Bill Jones****Spring Hill Red Hot Performance, John Bell**

Broke away at 1:33 pm. Red headed left at the top of the first hill. He was out of pocket, but showed in front as we approached the apple tree. At 7, Colt went on point on the right edge after the apple tree, but was then seen in pursuit of his quarry. Red showed well in the Hire's field, not missing an edge. He disappeared behind the island at 20, and was found standing. After the find, Red headed north, again showing great application. At 25, he came to a stop in the far right corner, but took some time to pin the birds. When he did, all was in order. Red scored again at 35 after working the dog leg field. Red disappeared to the front and was found standing at the top of the heading down to the boy scout bridge. He stayed forward down the hill and had another find just before the bridge. After the bridge, Red was found standing again off the right side of the hedgerow before the sorghum. After relocation, no bird was produced. Red ended the hour as he headed down cardiac hill.

Brace 18**Alder Zerandipty, Richard Johnson****Magnum High Velocity, Vince Anderson**

Broke away in the derby course at 2:47 pm. Zera took off forward, while Gauge took the right edge around the field. Zera went on point at 3 while Gauge was leashed for failing to back. After relocation, no bird was produced. Zera was in and out of pocket. At 30, after the S-turn, Zera jumped out of high cover and went on point in front of the bird planting UTV. No bird was produced and the judges allowed her to continue because they felt she was getting scent from the bird planting wagon. She disappeared to the front and was spotted by the

course marshal buried in the woods before the dyke. No bird was produced and she was leashed.

Brace 19**Over Under Reign The Field, Samantha Gauthier**

Broke away at 3:45. Reign didn't seem herself, perhaps being in season or wanting a bracemate. She cast up the right-side woods edge and crossed to the left side when she approached the orchard. Point was called, but nothing was produced after relocation. She continued her course at a steady pace. At 39, as we entered the derby course, Reign pointed on the right side of the hedgerow. After the find, Reign had trouble staying forward and was leashed.

Bits About Brittanys

by Clarence Goering

The following stories and cartoons have been reprinted from a manuscript that was intended to become a published book. This work was titled "BITS ABOUT BRITTANIES" and was written by Clarence Goering from Newton, Kansas. Clarence bought his first Brittany in 1942 it was a male he named Marquette Allamuchy. He was very active with Brittanies from that point until the 1960's. Being an active, well-known breeder during that era his kennel "TRIUMPH BRITTANIES" was nationally sponsored by Ralston Purina feed company. A copy of this manuscript was assembled into book form and is on display at the Brittany Field Trial Hall of Fame museum in Grand Junction, TN.

I Found One Here Yesterday

There has always been a question in the minds of men as to whether dogs are capable of thinking or reasoning. I have seen dogs do some things that made me seriously wonder if they didn't think or reason things out which caused him to act in a certain way. Fonzie's actions are an example to consider.

It was the opening of the dove season. I went to a farm pond to shoot the doves as they came flying in for their evening drink of water. I had taken Fonzie with me to retrieve my birds. The pond was in a pasture and due to lack of rain, the water was about 5 feet lower than normal. There were cattle in the pasture, and the pond was their only supply of water. There was a lot of silt on the bottom, so when the cattle walked up to the water they made deep holes in the mud, which later dried up. Thus the bank was full of holes—some of which were 18 to 20 inches deep.

As Fonzie was getting some exercise running around the area, a dove came by, and I shot it. The bird fell on the other side of the pond. I saw just where it fell and decided to wait till Fonzie came by so he could go with me to pick it up. Soon, he came by, and we went to find the dove. When I got to where I knew the bird had dropped, I looked around, but could not see it anywhere. Fonzie came over and all at once he stuck

his head down into one of those deep cattle tracks. His head was too big, so he started to dig to make the whole bigger. I thought this would be a good experience for him so I just waited until he had dug deep enough to pick up the bird. The hole into which it had fallen was at least 18 inches deep. You guessed it, when Fonzie gave me the bird, I gave him the head, which I figured he had earned.

The next evening, I again went hunting to the same place. The first thing Fonzie did was to check all the deep cattle tracks. He repeated this performance several times during the evening. I think he was thinking or reasoning "I found one here yesterday, there should be one today." A week later, I went back and he again checked all the deep tracks several times during the hunt. So I leave it up to you, do dogs sometimes think or reason? Draw your own conclusions. You are entitled to your own opinion.

Feathers and Furs

Ted and I have hunted quail together for many years. We have always had marvelous hunting and found many birds. This time we had an added attraction. We were working two of Ted's dogs and two of mine, Max and Fonzie.

The dogs made a beautiful point on a covey with

all four dogs standing a solid as a rock. We stepped in, flushed the birds, and dropped three of them. The dogs made the retrieves and we were ready to follow the birds which had landed in a pasture up ahead.

As we got to where the birds had landed, the dogs made several points on singles. Then as the dogs were working, Max made a point at the base of an old tree. The tree had been broken off about 6 feet above the ground. Since Ted was quite close to Max and I told him to go kick up the bird. He stepped up to Max and said, "There is no bird here, the ground is all bare." I told him to kick that little tuft of grass just on the other side of the tree. As he stepped forward, Max took a couple of steps and put his nose right up to the tree. Then Ted noticed Max was pointing at a hole at the base of a hollow tree. In looking in the hole, he discovered a raccoon.

Ted said, "Let's get this raccoon, because I can sell his carcass to a man in town for \$15." We pounded on the tree, but the raccoon wouldn't come out of the hole at the top. So Ted climbed the tree to look into the situation. To his surprise, there were two raccoons. After more attempts to chase the raccoons out, we finally got a long, thin branch off of a nearby willow. We started to push the branch in the hole where Max had pointed and when it got up to where the raccoons were, they both decided to jump out of the top. Ted grabbed a club and started after one and all four dogs tackled the other one. Ted got the one he was after and I got to the one the dogs had caught. So having bagged our limit of quail and two raccoons, Ted and I decided we had had a most successful and enjoyable day of hunting.

Drive... and Learning To Drive

In case you were wondering about the title and why it says drive twice, and you're trying to figure out what learning your drive has to do with training dogs, bear with us.

Let's imagine it's your dog's very first hunting season. That rookie year is always interesting and can play out in a lot of ways depending on the individual dog, and, of course, on you, the handler. The biggest factors outside the inherent talent of each individual dog is the training the dog's received. There are lots of ways that can happen. It might be a first-time dog owner struggling through on their own, or maybe training with a group to learn. Could be a long time hunter training the latest of several gun dogs over a lifetime. Or perhaps it's a dog just coming back from being trained by a pro.

In any of these situations, there will be a variety of outcomes during those first few hunts. Some dogs will go out that first time or two and just nail it, looking great. Others may be a bit confused at first, not sure why they're where they are until they get a bird contact or two, and then the mental switch flips on and they make the connection from training to actually hunting out in the real world. Some dogs may make that connection and completely lose their marbles and, in their excitement, forget they've ever been trained. Lots of variables to think about during those rookie outings, it will likely leave you wondering why the dog isn't perfectly doing what you spent time and money preparing him to do.

Remember when you were learning to drive a car? You took and passed the written test, then were issued your learner's permit, the temporary license that allowed you to actually get behind the wheel while under supervision and learn to drive the car. Driver's education classes were next. If you grew up on a farm, you probably were driving around the place on tractors or in the farm truck long before you were old enough to get that learner's permit, and learning to drive a vehicle out on the road came easily because you already had the basics down. On the flip side of that, if the first time you ever got behind the wheel was right after you received that temporary license to learn to drive, you were excited to learn while probably a bit unsure. In the early stages of learning to drive, a lot of things had to happen. Buckle up, check mirrors, turn the key, put it in gear, check for blind spots, use the gas and brake pedals,

turn signals, lights, parallel parking... and it was even more complicated back when you also had to use a clutch and manually shift. With experience, all those movements became reflexes that you didn't have to think about. Repetition created habits.

That's what the rookie dog is dealing with during his first season. For the dog, training is a lot like going through driver's education is for us. Training equals the learner's permit, where you (or a pro) are teaching the skill sets and creating the habits needed in the field. What's important to remember is that going through driver's education and getting a real license doesn't automatically mean every person who does that will be a good driver. Some of us immediately took that freedom and converted it to the need for speed and the accompanying ticket. Others had a fender bender and learned from that lesson. Some will be conservative and slower while they gain confidence, others will take to it like a fish to water.

The point is to remember that the rookie season means your dog has just gotten through "driver's ed" and is still learning how to put all the pieces together. Some will be naturals (good breeding helps!) and others will take more time. The key is continuing to instruct while the dog puts it all together. Patience and focusing on what the dog is showing you is important since this rookie year sets the tone for the rest. Give guidance where it's needed and plan on perhaps shooting a bit less while your dog learns which behaviors reward him and which ones do not.

There's another kind of "drive" with bird dogs, and something we've all heard. Phrases like, "that dog sure has a lot of drive" are pretty common. But what does that word really refer to? Most of the time it's a generic word, often used to describe a level of energy or enthusiasm, but the definition goes much deeper and is more varied than that.

Actual drive should refer to the basic, instinctive drives present in dogs. These include things such as prey drive,

meaning the desire to chase and catch something, which comes from the dog survival instinct to eat and kill for food; the drive to retrieve is also part of prey-chase drive, as is the food motivation often used when training. Pack drive refers to the desire to be with and work together with others, and that includes us as well as other dogs. Another example of drive is sex drive, which is pretty much a requirement for the survival of any species. That one is only problematic when it interferes with our dog's ability to follow directions. There are other behaviors some will call drives, but they're simply instinctive behaviors that tend not to override real drive behaviors. Drive behaviors can often border on the obsessive.

I've heard people say a dog has a lot of drive because he loves to run. For our purposes as bird hunters, that doesn't mean much unless it's coupled with prey drive. There are a lot of dogs that love to run long and fast. They aren't necessarily running with the urge to find birds, although they may stumble across a few. If they discover a bird while running, it's a happy accident rather than intentional. They just like feeling the wind whistling through their ears while the desire to use their nose comes in a distant second place. Now, combine that hard-running dog with one that is using his nose the whole time and focusing on the cover that may hold birds, and then you've got true hunting drive.

What about a dog that loves to chase a tennis ball in the backyard but isn't interested in chasing a crippled

bird we've shot? Is it a lack of prey drive? Possibly, but it can also be a lack of exposure to birds. If that same dog had been started as a puppy chasing a frozen or dead bird instead of a tennis ball, maybe things would be different. Regardless, prey-chase drive should be the number one thing we should be looking for, and should be a big factor in breeding. Good breeders will evaluate and specifically select dogs with the characteristics they want to see carry on in future generations.

Pack drive, the desire to work with us and with other dogs, is also important, as it lends itself to trainability. You can't hunt with a dog that doesn't want to hunt with you and for you. It has to be a team effort, whether the dog is pointing birds so you can shoot them for him to retrieve, or whether a dog is willing to honor another dog on point and work as a team member. A little independence can be good, especially in some competition situations, but it has to be coupled with enough trainability that you still have a team. A dog that refuses to back another dog's point and always wants to get ahead needs to be more of a team player and less of a "hold my beer and watch this!" independent. Conversely, the dog that always seems to be honoring and never finding first isn't what we're after either.

It all boils down to finding the right balance of drives in our dogs, and then getting them their learner's permit so they can start putting it all together in the field.

Multiple pheasants and sharp-tail were seen, pointed, or (unfortunately) chased on each of the courses which cover over 26 miles. A total of 27 dogs competed for a chance to win.

Many thanks to the Harms family for use of their land, helping with the dog wagons, and providing meals. On a daily basis horse water was filled into tubs they provided for each horse, hay was made available, and one of their buildings became the daily eating place. Without their hospitality there could be no trial. We are very thankful for the friendship & generosity of the Harms!

Our two judges were Justin Hess of Exira, Iowa and Jon Small of Pleasant Hill, Missouri. Both are friends and seasoned judges who spent their time in the saddle with a close eye on the dogs. Thank you for this!

The Running:

Brace 1: Prairie Wind Pistol Pete (Steve Ralph) and Arrow's Tequila Rustler (Richard Beaver)

Both started well with PD running the bigger race. There was a divided find at 33 in some cover in a ditch with all in order. Rusty had a stop to flush on a pheasant put up by the horses at 40. Rusty shortened some. PD continued on with a good race and finished well to the front.

Brace 2: Roustabout All In (Steve Ralph) and Countyline's That Guy (Stan Truksa)

Guy looked good under a bird at 9 in very short cover on top of a shand-hill. Al had a non-productive at 12 and then at 26 he was seen

going over a hill with multiple (over 20) birds in the air with him still moving ending his run.

Brace 3: Piney Run Zack (Kent Patterson) and Jagoub's Whodat Say Whodat When I Say Whodat?

Zack pointed in some cattails at 12 in an area that looked good for pheasants, but nothing could be produced. Zack got behind and suffered another non-productive and was picked up. Whodat ran a nice race with some nice casts and covered a lot of territory looking good the entire time down. Unfortunately she went birdless but while being picked up birds flushed wild in an area she would have been in in another 30 seconds.

Brace 4: Mr Staley (Dan Campbell) and Jowill's Sweet Mandolin Music (Joe Williams)

Mr Staley had trouble with meadow larks periodically and was finally pushed into a pheasant by his handler at 57. Manie had a nice pheasant find at 35 well off to the right. She had a little trouble staying to the front but did a nice job overall.

Brace 5: Piney Run Senor (Kent Patterson) and Jagoub's Spell Caster (Tom Jagielski)

Both dogs had a nice forward race but neither was able to find a bird.

Brace 6: Piney Run Hilltop Blew (Kent Patterson) and Burbon Time (Stan Williamson)

Blew pointed at 20 with no birds flushed. Both dogs seen together at 40 with one stopped, then a pheasant was seen in the air and both dogs moved in the direction the bird took but stopped.

Brace 7: Kashmir (Bret Lindback) and Cedar Valley Zeke (Jack Alexander)

Both dogs got tangled up with a bird at 15 and were relieved of duty.

Brace 8: Cedar Valley Luke (Steve Ralph) and Piney Run Jake (Kent Patterson)

Both started well but soon shortened. Both handlers picked up at 30 knowing they weren't having a good day.

Brace 9: El Grande (Robbie Myers) and CVK's Spartan King

(Jack Alexander)

Grande started well but left the main course at about 10 minutes, he continued on and caught up at 50 minutes after covering new territory. He had no bird work. Leo was brought back early and made large casts on edges and to the front. We left the valley and went into the hills where he pointed a six bird covey at 24 minutes. Heading toward a windmill for water he pointed again at 32 with a pheasant being flushed. Leo continued on for the hour with a strong forward race.

Brace 10: JJ's Levi The Lionheart (Joe Williams) and Roll On JJ (Jack Alexander)

Levi ran a consistent forward race for an hour but was unable to locate a bird. JJ was picked up early as he was a little inconsistent after his nice opening cast.

Brace 11: Countyline's Full Throttle (Stan Truksa) and Spanish Dancer (Robbie Myers)

Stan's young dog started well but got into sandburs which bothered him until he was picked up a little early. Dancer started out pretty well but as we crossed through a gate at 30 minutes the dog vanished and Robbie proceeded to look for his dog for about 10 minutes until his dog was spotted up front with the other dog. Robbie made his way to the front and arrived just as his dog pointed a pheasant with all in order. Dancer finished well.

Brace 12: Piney Run Patch (Kent Patterson) and Georgia's Tiger 2.0 (Jack Alexander)

Both started well forward. Kent lost track of Patch, so climbed a

sandhill and spotted his dog behind and to the left on point. No birds were produced. Tiger ran into a bird going downwind but forgot to stop. Patch continued on with a stop to flush at 56.

Brace 13: CVK's Jungleground (Steve Ralph) and Rajin's Buddy Boy (Robbie Myers)

Clarence started off well but went over a ridge never to be seen again. Buddy ran forward but got too close to a pheasant at 27 and was done for the day.

Brace 14: JWB's Arctic Cat (Jack Alexander)

Kimber got a little behind early but then stayed forward. She pointed in a likely spot at 35 but no birds were produced. She continued on but was not able to locate a bird.

In an age of club decline, lost grounds, and economic challenges, there remains an oasis for the Brittany all age stalwart... The Harms Cattle Company. Located south of Valentine, NE, the Harms family has done more for the all age Brittany over the last decade than any landowner in the United States. Their generosity and dedication to the breed is only exceeded by their desire to make both the Region 19 and Pheasant Classic better year over year. The American Brittany Club's Pheasant Classic was the first "bird" classic created by the parent organization. and Garmin. These fine partners provide equipment or product in support of this sport in a broad and generous manner.

It was great seeing friends for the first time since spring. Gene and Sherry Stewart flew out from Pennsylvania, their dog Flatwood Tiger won the Pheasant Championship in 1991. Steve Chang, Ed Tillson, and Tom Tracy brought their string of competitors along with amateur handlers Dan Campbell, Stan Truska, and Kent Patterson. Owners Bob Rankin, Jack Alexander, Crystal Alexander, Tom Jagielski, Steve Ralph, Sue Januska, Brett Lindback, Bob Travis, Mary Karbinger and Stan Williamson came to see their charges on these beautiful grounds.

We were blessed to have two judges with a wealth of experience and knowledge look over the field of starters. Kelli Aiken, based out of Kansas, spends the summer in the sand hills of Nebraska fine tuning her string of Irish Setters. She won or placed in every stake at the Irish Setter Nationals in 2022 held at Blue Mountain Wildlife Demonstration Unit in Booneville AR. Missouri pro trainer Justin Crook also spends his summers in the sand hills northeast of Bassett, NE. His highly competitive string of shooting dog pointers and setters are primarily campaigned over the Midwest circuit. Bud Moore was traveling with Justin as they traveled all day from Wisconsin to arrive in time to begin the championship. We appreciate the enormous effort of both judges in making this a stellar event.

With a course of this magnitude, having dogs available for successive braces is a challenge. It requires someone who knows

the ground, courses, gates, and equipment to safely transport humans and canines. John Harms took time out of his busy schedule using his UTV to guide everyone through the scenic 26-mile course that challenged all competitors.

1st - The champion was found in Piney Run Hilltop Blew. The 4 yr old was coming off a good prior season having won both the Chicken Championship and the National Amateur Championship. Bred by Martha Greenlee of Baskerville VA, trained by Ben Lorensen of Corinna ME, and handled by his owner Kent Patterson, Blew spent the summer in the sand hills honing his skills on Prairie Chickens and Sharp-tail Grouse. Released west of marsh in the Lord meadow, he ran the edges past the burned baler swinging west to a far windmill where he went south for an extended period but recovered as the course swings north. At 35, he went under a fence and froze in cover where only his head and tip of tail could be seen. Kent flushed multiple pheasants to the east with all manners in order. He continued his robust swings through the hills, the bog pasture, and ground south of the Harsh meadow. He carried his speed, power, and dimension evenly throughout the hour.

2nd - Jaboub's Spell Caster (Tabu) is owned by Tom and Debbie Jagielski on the string of Tom Tracy. Tabu was cast away into the Trout hills. At 17, there was a divided find on the hill as the course drops down into the Lord Meadow. She cruised the margins of the marsh and shot west to a tree grove where point was called, Tommy putting pheasants in the air with all manners in order. As the course turned into the Alkali Hills, she pointed a pheasant hiding in the grassy fencerow. Into the hills, she maintained the front and was credited with a chicken find at 50. She spent the final minutes of the hour along the edges of the north meadow.

3rd - TMR Lucky Bets was away from the south hills windmill barking with glee as the party pushed east. Bets was smooth and forward toward the Duck Camp while hunting the margins along the Ballard Marsh and south hills. At 39, he skimming along the creek edge west of the bale yard and credited with a stop to flush. Taken on into the North Trout Hills, he continued his probing casts and credited with mannerly finds at 47 and 51. He finished nicely.

4th - Piney Run Patch is owned by Martha Greenlee, trained by Ben Lorensen and handled by Kent Patterson. This was Patch's first summer on the prairies and the spacious expanse of the country was to his liking. Released on the afternoon course near camp, he went out of sight to the west. At 10, he was gathered up and sent into the north meadow where he rimmed the marsh and sailed to the base of the North Hills nearly a quarter mile away. He was watered at the lake and sent west toward Alkali Lake. At 22, he dropped into a low bowl as scout Crystal Alexander was trying to lift her cap to call point but it was getting hung up on her pony tail. It took the handler some time to figure out her actions and as he and the judge rode to the dog, a pheasant came out of the bowl with Patch standing proudly at the far end. He continued his hour through the Alkali Hills to the Lord Meadow with power.

The Running

Brace 1: Mr. Staley – Dan Campbell; Wingra's Indy-Go! – Ed

Tillson. The grass was clad in dew and the gallery in jackets as Doc and Indy sprinted away at 8:00 am and 36 degrees. Both moved well and maintained the front for the first quarter of the hour as the course runs into the south hills to a windmill tank. Watered, both dogs went east as we move toward the Ballard Marsh Duck camp at moderate range. Indy had a nonproductive at 40 as the course rims the southern edge of the Ballard Marsh. At 45, both dogs took a north fence line where birds were seen coming out the high grass. Indy was seen moving as Doc stood for the event with Dan firing. Doc finished nicely along lines south of camp near the bale yard.

Brace 2: CVK's Spartan King – Tom Tracy; Godfather's F.N. Rockstar – Steve Chang. Leo and Rocky were released from the bale yard southwest across the meadow and creek leading to the Trout hills. Birds were seen in the air near the entrance but no dog was involved. Leo is a 3-time winner of the event and was stretching the front over the early half of the hour and pointed at 20. Tommy pointed west and fired but the judge didn't see the birds. Rocky had been maintaining the front at moderate range as we drop down into the Lord Meadow. Leo had a nonproductive at 40 along the marsh as Steve was working hard to get Rocky out of the marsh and was recovered with a find at 47 in a mott north of the gate, with all manners in order. Leo made an extended cast south once the party cleared the marsh that took some time to recover him. Both dogs finished in the Alkali Feedlot hills.

Brace 3: Wild Wild Willie – Ed Tillson; JWB Arctic Cat – Tom Tracy. It was 54 degrees under sunny skies as Willie and Kimber sprinted away from the Alkali Feedlot gate. Kimber scored first in the hills with her usual striking style, all manners in order. Crossing the Alkali meadow to catch the front, she had a stop to flush near the creek at 12. Willie was credited with a stop to flush on a pheasant at 20 in the west meadow as Kimber was pointed in a shelter belt to the west. At 24, Willie was pointed. As the gallery rode toward him, the pheasant got up and it was more than he could stand to end his hour. Kimber came through the west meadow then went south toward Alkali Lake with Tommy asking for the tracker at 50.

Brace 4: Piney Run Patch – Kent Patterson; Hoochie Coochie Man – Ed Tillson. Patch and Carl were away for the afternoon braces headed west toward the Alkali Feed lot. Patch's hour was outlined above. Carl was listening well and maintaining the front through the west meadow. He was watered at the lake and hunted the base of the hills as the party went west toward Alkali Lake. He began to shorten as we approached the Alkali Hills with Ed electing to pick up.

Brace 5: Urban American Legend – Steve Chang; Countyline's That Guy – Stan Truska. Urbie and Guy were away at the east gate exit of the Alkali Hills. Both dogs were busy and maintaining contact with their handlers over the first half of the hour. Urbie had a nonproductive at 40 in the Lord Meadow. Both dogs were at medium range through the Trout Hills finishing near the windmill leading to the Harsh Meadow. No birds credited to either dog.

Brace 6: Big Mac XIV – Steve Change; Almaden's Under Lock and Key – Ed Tillson. Sue Januska was in the gallery to watch Mac as temps had climbed into the 80's. Oudi and Mac were away near the Harsh Meadow. Both moved well as the party traversed

the south hills and were watered at the tank headed east toward the duck camp. At 40, Oudi was pointed with Ed unable to produce any birds with relocation. At 45, Ed elected to pick up. Mac had a nonproductive at 50 near the Ballard Marsh and a find at 54 along the edge of the South Hills. Mac had a skunk find at 55 that had everyone nervous but it must have fired him up as he had a strong finish along the Ballard Marsh margins.

DAY 2

Brace 7: Countyline's Full Throttle – Stan Truska; Prairie Wind Pistol Pete – Tracy. 45 degrees with winds out of the north greeted Mack and PD as they sprinted south. PD was the first to make a move over the hills east of the gallery. PD was pointed in a ravine at 10 with Mack backing up the hill. A large coyote bedded down finally got nervous enough to bolt west. Both dogs were absent to the west for an extended time as the gallery sat near the windmill. PD was the first to show coming out the hills from high on the bluff as the gallery turned east up the valley. Mack was recovered shortly thereafter and brought forward where he went back in the hills south. At 40, PD shot north on a big cast toward the duck camp. At 43, Stan asked for the tracking receiver. PD continued strong along the Ballard Marsh finishing near the windmill to west. He needed a bird!

Brace 8: Scout's Upland Trail-Blazer – Steve Chang; CVK's Jungleground – Tom Tracy. Scout and Clarence sprinted west from the gate south of camp at 9:15 with temps in the low 50's. They were together into the bale yard meadow as the party crossed the creek. At the gate into Trout Hills, Scout was seen on point to the north with Clarence coming around the hill and birds in the air. After it was all stopped, both dogs had dog wagon tickets.

Brace 9: Piney Run Zack – Kent Patterson; Jagoub's Spell Caster - Tom Tracy. Tabu's hour was outlined above. Zack was away into the Trout hills. At 17, there was a divided find on the hill as the course drops down into the Lord Meadow. Zack had a nonproductive at 30 near the Alkali Feed Lot gate and another at 45 in the hills to end his bid.

Brace 10: Jagoub's Whodat Say Whodat When I say Whodat? – Tom Tracy; Noble Southpaw – Steve Chang. Whodat and Manny sprinted east from the Alkali Meadow and showed nicely along the base of the hills that border the north meadow. Watered at the lake and into the west meadow both were working hard in search of game as the temps were steadily rising. They finished at moderate range just short of the Lord Meadow with no game to their credit.

Brace 11: Piney Run Hilltop Blew – Kent Patterson; Code of Noble – Steve Chang. Blew's hour was outlined earlier. Morris had his sneakers on this day with big moves around the Lord Meadow and further south at the west windmill. He went south at an extreme level in the Trout Hills that took some time for him to return as the party dropped out of the hills near the bog pasture. He continued to run the southern margins as the hour ended in the Harsh Meadow with no bird work to his credit.

Brace 12: Piney Run Senõr – Kent Patterson; Cedar Valley Luke – Tom Tracy. Luke had been injured in the amateur championship days earlier and was a scratch. Big was released in the Harsh Meadow then through the gate into the South Hills. He

was watered at the windmill and taken east toward the duck camp with finds at 33 and 40 on pheasants with all manners in order. At 43 along the Ballard Marsh margin, Big froze with a large pheasant sent out over the lowland. The heat was taking a toll on the young dog so Kent elected to pick up at 50 near camp.

DAY 3

Brace 13: Piney Run Jake – Kent Patterson; Kashmir – Tom Tracy. Jake and Kashmir were away at 8:00 on the last day of the championship. Kashmir went southwest and took some coaxing back to the course that entered the hills. Jake was at moderate range over the early portions of the course. Both handlers elected to pick up at the windmill. Overcast skies greeted those gathered at breakaway. Kashmir and Gunner worked both sides of the Ballard Marsh meadow to the 10 minute mark. Gunner pointed at 12 and went with the birds to get a ride on the dog wagon. Kashmir was watered at the South Hills meadow and made the big swing east. He was smooth and forward through the South Hills and credited with a find at 42 near the Harsh Meadow. He finished ahead toward the bog pasture.

Brace 14: Roustabout's All In – Tom Tracy; TMR's Lucky Bets – Steve Chang. Bets hour was outlined above. Al was flashy over the early portions of the course swinging with Tommy as the gallery turned north near the duck camp. He maintained the long lines near the marsh heading west into the meadow south of camp. He had a nonproductive at 43 near the North Trout Hills gate and finished strong in the hills.

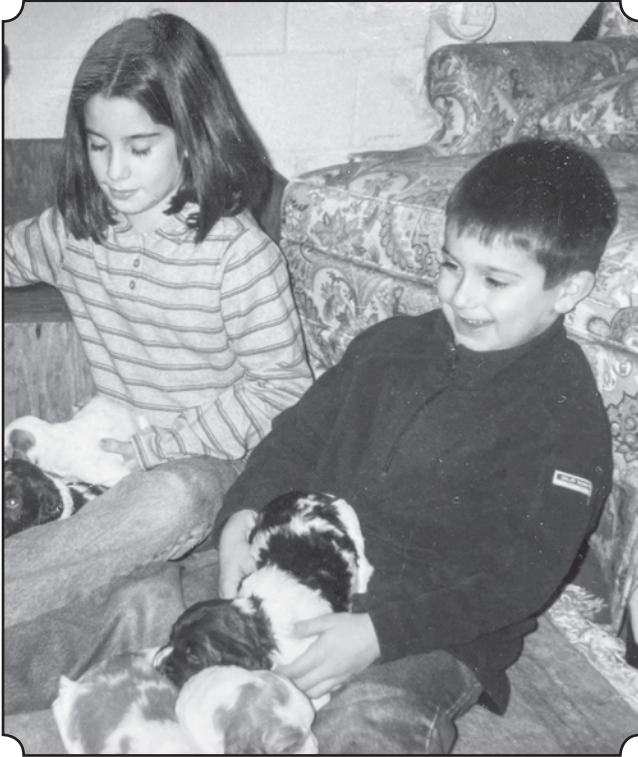

The Magic Dancer

In a way she could be termed a rescue Brittany. AKC name was Tally's Magic, whelped January 1, 2001. She was the third pup whelped from a litter of eight. She was liver/white and during the whelping process, a rather unusual incident took place.

Her dam, Tally, cleaned Magic following birth; then proceeded to lick and clean the two previously whelped pups. Tally then observed that Magic was not breathing. With her mouth, Tally picked up the newborn pup just behind its front legs, raising her own head up, and gently jostled the pup until it started to breathe.

It seemed like a miracle. Pup had her name - Magic. For the next seven years Magic was a family pet, who spent time being best friend with two young kids. She ruled the roost so to speak. She lived in an outside insulated kennel with her mother, Tally, and because the family residence was in a somewhat rural area, Magic was often free to run the fields and woods. She was free to hunt on her own.

But one day all that came to an end when her mother passed and Magic then developed over the next several months a habit of literally "dancing" in the kennel on her two back legs. Probably it was her frustration of now living only with herself.

Within the next year the family decided to build a new home in a residential development that did not allow outside kennels. It was at this time that Magic would come to live in our kennel, where there would be three other Brittanys with whom she could socialize. It was a major adjustment for her. She continued to show her frustration and boredom by "dancing" on her two back legs up against the kennel fencing.

Within a few months it was decided to determine how much bird finding ability she had. Exposure would be to pigeons. Result being Magic was absolutely bird "crazy" – pointing and chasing. And oh, how she could run! With a tracking collar on her; during an early training session, it was determined her location was well over a mile away from our position on four-wheelers. But true to her early life stage of "free to run", within the hour, Magic returned to her starting location.

Next part of the "re-training program" was to determine if there was a possibility of her becoming a dog that could be hunted and controlled to become steady to wing. After numerous sessions with a professional trainer, bottom-line was not favorable. In this instance at her age of soon turning nine, that old adage of "an old dog may not be able to be taught new tricks" came into effect.

Magic did, however, for the next four years become my buddy. When the weather would permit, she was run with a four-wheeler at least two to three times a week. In addition there were numerous times when she was hitched to the four-wheeler as my own house yard-work was the objective – trimming bushes and trees.

At the beginning of this piece it was suggested Magic could be considered a rescue Brittany. In reality it could be said she rescued me. Often when working/training her, there were times my frustration would surface. It was difficult to train when Magic had no intention of paying attention. Those were instances when my patience "ran thin". But it was a learning process in dealing with those situations. She taught me to be a better person when working dogs.

Just six weeks from her 14th date of birth, Magic went to sleep one night and did not wake the next morning. She was an important member of the Brittanys that have been in our household; rest in peace Magic.

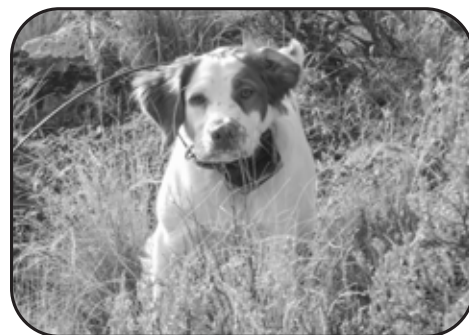

Friday, Dec 2, 2022: The weather was cloudy, damp and in the 50's for running the event's braces.

Brace 1:

a) Crosscreek Sovereign Caught Up In Legends – Bob Burchett

b) Diamond Hill Young Sheldon (Sheldon) – Scott Johnson

These two dogs complemented each other in ground race. Bob pointed out his dog multiple times. At 11 minutes, point was called for Sheldon and with a nice covey find, we were off to the front. Bob's dog went left at Lick Creek and Sheldon took to the right. Bob's dog shortened up a bit then went wide. Both dogs came together making a nice wide cast in the open field heading towards the gate. As we came to the bridge both dogs went left and finished deep into the fields.

Brace 2

a) Spartan King Kidd (Kidd) – Stan Williamson

b) K.C. Little Skye Diamond (Skye) – Scott Johnson

Kidd was digging in the brush hunting hard. The dogs handled nicely as they made the hairpin turn. At 27 both dogs hit point on a nice size covey. Skye was very staunch through the flush and both dogs took off together after the shot heard around the world (Stan's shot). Neither dog minded as the birds scattered everywhere with the dogs in hot pursuit. Kidd's range shortened as Skye was more forward.

After going past the Oak, through to the second big field, Rona hit point hard down at the bottom edge. No dogs had gone there yet and Rona was awarded with bird work. Burton's excitement was obvious as Rona was displaying the "WOW" factor, not only with her bird work, but her effortless stride and masterful moves. Coming from the far-right side, crossing over the two-track, she continued taking the next edge all the way down on her own and went straight through a cut to the next field without hesitation or missing a stride. The longer she was on the ground the better she seemed to become,

always rolling forward even at 55 minutes when she cruised the edge of the riverbottom with plenty more left in her tank. WOW! Well done!

Arcadia Wildlife Management Area

The New England Brittany Wild Bird Championship is run at the Arcadia Wildlife Management Area in Exeter, Rhode Island. This state owned Management Area of 12,000 acres is controlled by the state of Rhode Island departments of Forestry, Parks and Recreation and Fish and Wildlife. The habitat is rolling New England woodland, a lot of which is overgrown abandoned farm land interspersed with meandering cold water trout streams and ponds. The area is located about ten miles inland from the southern New England Atlantic seashore. The weather in this area is a lot milder than further inland and north towards Massachusetts, Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine. The northward bound spring migration of woodcock tend to stage in this area for a few weeks during late March and early April, waiting for the weather to get milder to the north so they can continue on to their summer breeding grounds in northern New England and the Canadian Maritime Provinces.

Wild bird championships began running on these Arcadia grounds in the early 1980's. During those early years the trials were run around the Labor Day weekend. In spite of the warm weather at that time of year, the seven one-hour courses were all laid out along the cold water trout streams. The dogs were always within a couple of minutes of the cold water and the temperature along those streams was always several degrees cooler because of the forest overhead cover. These early fall events were run on wild birds that were native to the area. When that native bird population began to decline, the trials were then moved to the spring. For the last fifteen years that the trials have been run in the spring, there has always been sufficient amount of migrating birds available, and in some years, way too many. To run wild bird field trial events you have to go where the birds are available in sufficient numbers to create a level playing field where all dogs have an equal opportunity.

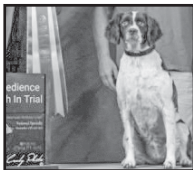
